## Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol – PNP ID Badge Renewal Form (page 2)



#### The following requirements apply to all Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol members:

- Reside in the City of Phoenix.
- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Possess a valid driver's license or a state issued ID card.
- Complete mandatory Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Training.
- Members are NOT police officers and are NOT empowered by the Phoenix Police Department.
- Follow all participation requirements to remain a member in good standing with this program.
- Obey all traffic laws and carry a valid driver's license in their possession when operating a vehicle on patrol.
- Affix approved signs to their vehicle while on patrol.
- Restrict patrol activities to public places and obtain authorization from owners/agents of nonpublic areas before engaging in a patrol of those locations.
- Wear approved shirt and carry their PNP identification card while on patrol.
- Patrol only their own neighborhood or a neighborhood they are familiar with. An exception to this restriction is working with an organized group patrol or when participating in a citywide event.
- Patrol solo only during daylight hours (dawn to dusk) and only upon earning solo status.
- Identify themselves as a PNP member to police when becoming involved in a police incident.

#### Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol members WILL NOT:

- Put themselves or others in danger at any time.
- Use red or blue lights on their vehicles while engaging in any type of "traffic control" situations (ONLY AMBER. lights on a stationary vehicle are acceptable) while in the capacity of a Phoenix Neighborhood Patroller.
- PNP members will not drive their vehicles while any emergency lights are activated.
- Carry firearms, knives, Tasers or other types of weapons (with the exception of pepper spray used for defensive purposes only) during times they are patrolling and representing the Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Program.
- Patrol while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, any drug or vapor releasing substance when impaired to the slightest degree.
- Approach suspects or suspect vehicles.
- Approach a crime scene unless directed to do so by a police officer.
- Interfere with the work of police officers at a crime scene. Police Officers are responsible for controlling police incidents.

### A VIOLATION OF ANY OF THESE REQUIREMENTS MAY RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION FROM THE PROGRAM.

Failure to comply with the listed requirements may be grounds for suspensions or disqualification from the Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol program. These requirements are not intended to prohibit any reasonable action a citizen would take to save or protect human life.
